

CHC43315 CERTIFICATE IV IN MENTAL HEALTH

ABOUT THE COURSE

This qualification prepares workers to support individuals affected by mental illness and psychiatric disabilities through community services. It covers roles in rehabilitation, mental health promotion, and community-based activities. Workers may engage in preventing relapse, promoting recovery, and facilitating participation through residential programs, clinical settings, home outreach, and center-based initiatives. They may also be involved in support employment and respite care within community-based non-government organizations.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

DOMESTIC STUDENTS

Training and assessments are conducted in English. A pre training intake interview will be conducted and each learner will undertake a Language, Literacy and Numeracy Assessment.

There are no pre-requisites or any other training package entry requirement to enrol in this course.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

English requirements:

- Must have an IELTS score of 6.0 or
- Must have a TOEFL iBT score of 64 or
- Must have a PTE Academic score of 50 or
- Must have a Cambridge English Advanced (CAE) score of 169 or
- Must have an OET score of at least B for each component
- Must be 18 Years or older
- Completed Australian year 12 or equivalent

- International: 52 weeks

TRAINING DELIVERY

- Classroom delivery: Face to face training and Practical Placement.
- Please note that the assessment methods for this course includes Theory component and mandatory practical placement component of 120 hours. You must complete placement hours to be able to achieve the competency in the units and successfully complete the course
- Virtual Classroom Delivery: Theory delivery via zoom & Face to Face practicals as required in the qualification
